#### F. Discussion

#### 1. Discussion of Downtown Event Rental Properties

The DDA would like to expand the current policy on rental of City property in the downtown district to include all feasible city property such as parking lots, under the bridge, etc as part of the rental agreement so that requirements for fees and insurance can be applied equally across the board no matter where an event is held downtown.

The following was discussed: Potential areas in addition to what is currently being used for rental space. When and how are City resources being used. The City already has designated rental space available to anyone who wishes to use them. Additional rental spaces along with any road closures would need to come before Council. In the next discussion a map displaying potential rental spaces in downtown would be beneficial.

#### G. Contracts/Agreements

#### 1. Property Appraisal for Transco Pipeline

Michael Hill, Assistant Gas Department Head stated he requests approval of a letter of acceptance for our bid regarding two parcels at \$3,500.00 each, totaling \$7,000.00, along the path of the Transco Distribution Line.

A motion to approve the letter of acceptance for the bid totaling \$7,000 along the path of the Transco Distribution Line was made by Council Member Hodge and seconded by Council Member Roth. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

#### 2. Mission Road Sewer Phase III – CSX Agreement

Bob Jones, Water Department Head stated Construction of the Mission Road Sewer – Phase III will require boring under CSX facilities which cross Mission Road near the Downtown Stables. Installation of the bore requires execution of the Facility Encroachment Agreement which gives the City permission to work in and under the railroad right-of-way. The agreement requires a one-time payment not to exceed \$13,825.00. This is a budgeted item and will be paid through account: Mission Rd Sewer Replacement. It is recommended for approval.

Motion approve the Mission Road Sewer Phase III – CSX Agreement was made by Council Member Cooley and seconded by Council Member Fox. Motion carried unanimously. Vote: 5-0.

#### H. Engineering Services

### 1. Goodwyn, Mills & Cawood – Engineering Services Agreement/Rogers Station Design

Mr. Jones stated the Water Department has selected Goodwyn, Mills & Cawood (GMC) to design the Rogers Station Water Main Replacement. This being our first project with GMC, the City needs to execute our standard Engineering Services Agreement (ESA) in order to begin work

GMC has provided the Task Order outlining design, bid and construction services for the Rogers Station Water Main Replacement Project. The proposal is comprised of the following three major components: Easement & Design Survey Daniel Baker, PC \$26,575.00; Engineering & Design \$63,086.00; Bid Support & Evaluation \$5,000.00; and Construction Administration / Inspection \$25,000.00 for a total of \$119,661.00.

Mr. Jones recommended approval of the ESA with GMC and their proposed fee for the design of Rogers Station Water Main in the amount of \$119,661.00. This is a budgeted item and will be paid from the Water Main Replacement account.

A motion to approve Goodwyn, Mills & Cawood Engineering Services Agreement/Rogers Station Design was made by Council Member Roth and seconded by Council Member Fox. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

#### I. Bid Award/Purchases

#### 1. 300 kVA Transformer Purchase

Don Hassebrock, Electric Department Head stated the Electric Department needs to purchase a transformer to replenish our stock for the transformer used at Jimmy John's Restaurant. City Electric has received 4 bids for the replacement unit. The Electric Department is recommending that Council approve the low bid and low Total Ownership Cost for the purchase of the CG transformer from Irby Co for \$7,481.00. This is a budgeted item in the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Budget.

A motion to approve 300 kVA Transformer Purchase from Irby Co for \$7,481.00 was made by Council Member Cooley and seconded by Council Member Roth. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

#### 2. Finalize 2017 Green Energy Purchases

Mr. Hassebrock stated in 2017, the Electric Department entered into an agreement with Sterling Planet to buy Green Energy Certificates and then sell them to Aquafil for their use. The certificates would allow Aquafil to demonstrate they use 100 % Renewable, Green Energy. At the end of 2017, we had to match Aquafil's actual usage with the number of certificates they needed. To have the necessary number of certificates, Aquafil needs to purchase an additional 1,594,975 kWh of certificates at a price of \$.0008 per kWh for a total purchase price of \$1,275.98. The Electric Department is asking Council to approve the contracts with Sterling

Planet and Aquafil for the purchase of the additional Green Energy Certificates.

A motion to approve the final 2017 Green Energy Certificates was made by Council Member Cooley and seconded by Council Member Roth. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

#### 3. CHP Health Awareness Program

Dan Porta, Assistant City Manager stated back in November the City Council previously approved an agreement with Corporate Health Partners (CHP) to provide a health awareness program and culture building program for city employees. Essentially the health awareness program will provide our employees with onsite biometric screening with a consult on the results of that screening along with an online wellness assessment. The proposed cost of this is \$25,996.00. The proposed cost of the culture building program is \$35,360 and would provide 8 hours per week of CHP personnel to help promote wellness to our employees. At this time, the City recommends the health awareness program at a cost of \$25,996 and if additional help is required, that the City contract with CHP as needed.

A motion to approve the mandatory health awareness screenings for all employees excluding the Fire Department was made by Council Member Stepp and seconded by Council Member Roth. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

Council Member Hodge made a motion to add two items to the agenda. The motion was seconded by Council Member Roth; motion carried unanimously. Vote: 5-0.

#### J. Contracts/Agreements

#### 1. IGA – Service Delivery Strategy

Mayor Santini stated at the last City Council meeting, the City Council approved him to sign the Bartow County and the local municipalities Service Delivery Strategy (SDS) application to the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) which was due on February 28th. In case there are any questions from DCA or changes that are agreed to by Bartow County and the local municipalities, it is recommended that an SDS Extension is submitted which provides a 6 month extension. This extension is a backup in case changes are made to the original submitted SDS form and is recommended for your approval and the Mayor's signature.

The added item of a Resolution from Bartow County confirms his actions from the January 18, 2018 meeting with the approval of the IGA Service Delivery Strategy. The Mayor stated he would sign the Resolution tonight and wait on the agreement and sign it if needed.

A motion to approve both the IGA Service Delivery Strategy and Resolution was made by Council Member Stepp and seconded by Council Member Hodge. Motion carried unanimously. Vote 5-0.

Sam Grove, City Manager stated the second added item is a Resolution from State Representative Powell, House Resolution 158, which requires the State to spend funds for the

purpose for which they have been collected.

Motion to approve the Resolution was made by Council Member Stepp and seconded by Council Member Roth. Motion carried unanimously. Vote: 5-0.

Congruently, Z00-12, requested the rezoning of 8.51 acres from MN (Mining) to MF-14, also for the purposes of developing Avonlea (south parcel). Both zoning cases were adopted on 11-2-00. Both zoning cases were approved with the following conditions: *Maximum # of units be 228 with only a 10% plus or minus tolerance for the final count;* Final count of (90)-1BR units, (102)- 2BR units and (36)- 3BR units.

An additional condition providing a 10ft easement along E. Main Street was included for Z00-12.

Avonlea was constructed on a combined assemblage of 16.622 acres with 10 residential buildings containing a total of 228 units.

For this application, the applicant wishes to construct a 238 unit multi-family residential development (apartments) on 53 acres. Approximately 30 acres are directly impacted by the development. The 53 acre site was previously mined. Mining activities have created conditions that make it difficult to develop the entire site. The 238 units will be incorporated in eight (8) buildings oriented around three (3) parking lot areas primarily central and to the east of the site. The project will be accessed from the existing driveway that services Avonlea from E. Main Street.

The price point for the apartments is anticipated to be set at the higher end market value, similar to Avonlea.

The Owner/Developer will be responsible for all costs for sewer line extensions and upgrades to existing sewer lines necessary to serve the proposed development.

<u>Cartersville School System:</u> Per a letter received from the Superintendent, Dr. Hinesley, additional time is being requested to consider the effects of this proposed project on school system resources. See attached.

#### **Public Comments:**

#### STANDARDS FOR EXERCISE OF ZONING POWERS.

1. The existing land uses and zoning of nearby property.

The existing land use to the East and Northeast is, generally, forested and undeveloped following the completion of the mining activities. The Avonlea apartments are also located to the east. Two Residential neighborhoods are located to the west. One neighborhood on Timber Ridge Drive is unincorporated and zoned R-3, multi-family, for townhomes. The second neighborhood is in the City and zoned R-10 along MLK Blvd and High Moon Street. A few lots on High Moon Street are unincorporated and zoned A1 (Agriculture). To the south and southwest are commercial properties.

Because of the available greenspace and natural buffers, the adjacent land uses are not expected to be adversely impacted.

2. The suitability of the subject property for the zoned purposes.

The site was formerly used for mining. Mining activities have ended. Rezoning the property may allow more land use options not afforded in the mining category.

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- 3. The relative gain to the public, as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner.
  - No additional mining activities will occur, so the land as currently zoned may serve no purpose except as undeveloped, green space. The owner wishes to use the land in a manner that will return the highest and best use. Rezoning and redevelopment for a multi-family use may satisfy a need in the community by providing additional housing options.
- 4. Whether the subject property has a reasonable economic use as currently zoned.

  If the land has been exhausted of its' minerals and mining interest, the property may not have a reasonable economic use as currently zoned.
- 5. Whether the zoning proposal will permit a use that is suitable in view of the use and development of adjacent and nearby property.

  The zoning proposal may permit a use that is suitable in view of the use of the adjacent residential and commercial properties. The proposed use may not be appropriate if mining activities are occurring or may still occur on the adjacent northeast properties that shall remain zoned for Mining.
- Whether the proposed zoning will adversely affect the existing use or usability of adjacent or nearby property.
   The proposed zoning is not expected to have an adverse effect on the existing use or
  - The proposed zoning is not expected to have an adverse effect on the existing use or usability of the adjacent properties unless the proposed use would restrict future activities on the adjacent mining properties.
- 7. Whether the zoning proposal is in conformity with the current future development plan and community agenda of the comprehensive land use plan as currently adopted or amended in the future.
  - The zoning proposal generally conforms with the Future Development Map and Comprehensive Land Use Plan.
- 8. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could adversely affect the environment, including but not limited to drainage, wetlands, groundwater recharge areas, endangered wildlife habitats, soil erosion and sedimentation, floodplain, air quality, and water quality and quantity.
  - Development resulting from an approved zoning proposal would be required to meet all local, state, and federal environmental regulations. No adverse effects are anticipated if all environmental regulations are adhered to.
- 9. Whether the zoning proposal will result in a use which will or could cause an excessive or burdensome use of existing streets, transportation facilities, utilities, or schools.
  - The zoning proposal is not expected to create a burden on public facilities or utilities. A traffic study may be required for the project by the City of by the Georgia Department of Transportation.

10. Whether there are other existing or changing conditions affecting the use and development of the property which give supporting grounds for either approval or disapproval of the zoning proposal.

There are no other known conditions affecting the use or development of the property. New development along this section of E. Main Street continues to be proposed and is expected to continue.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

The proposed zoning should have minimal impact on adjacent residential properties as long as all natural buffers are implemented. The proposed land use may be appropriate for the property and adjacent properties, unless mining activities continue or may continue on the adjacent properties to the east and northeast. The proposed land use is also consistent with the Future Development Map, the Future Land Use Map and the goals and policies set forth in Comprehensive Plan for E. Main Street. Utilities for residential and commercial use are available for the project along E. Main Street.

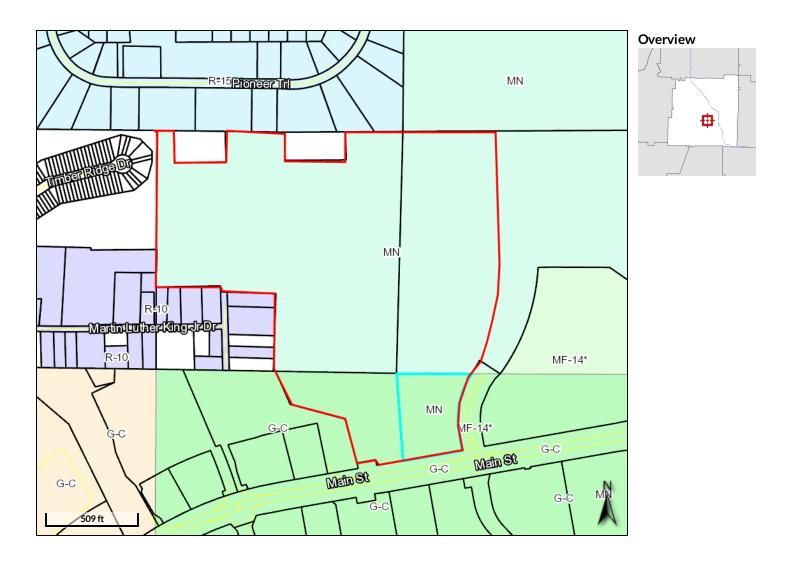

Thank you for the opportunity to review the application to rezone 53 acres on East Main Street, adjacent to Avonlea Apartments. It is my understanding the proposed rezoning is to change the current zoning of mining and general commercial to multi-family so a 238 unit apartment complex can be built.

I have serious concerns regarding the proposed rezoning. Approval of the application will have a significant impact on our school district facilities, transportation and student services. Sound practice is for a city to have a 70% ownership and 30% rental ratio. Prior to the recession in 2008, the property ownership/rental ratio in Cartersville was approximately 68% ownership and 32% rental. Since the recession, there has been a significant increase in rental property in the city causing an imbalance in the desired ownership/rental ratios. The latest city data shows a 50.1% property ownership compared to 49.9% rental property. The latest State of Georgia data shows the state with a 62.8% home ownership with 37.2% rental property. Based on this information, Cartersville is significantly out of balance and trending even more so. Therefore, we strongly oppose this project.

I would like to respectfully request consideration of this application be delayed until the March meeting so a representative of the school system can be present to make a presentation to the Planning Commission. I am requesting this continuance because of the late notice we received about this application. We do not have anyone knowledgeable of this situation available to speak to the Planning Commission at the February 6, 2018 meeting.

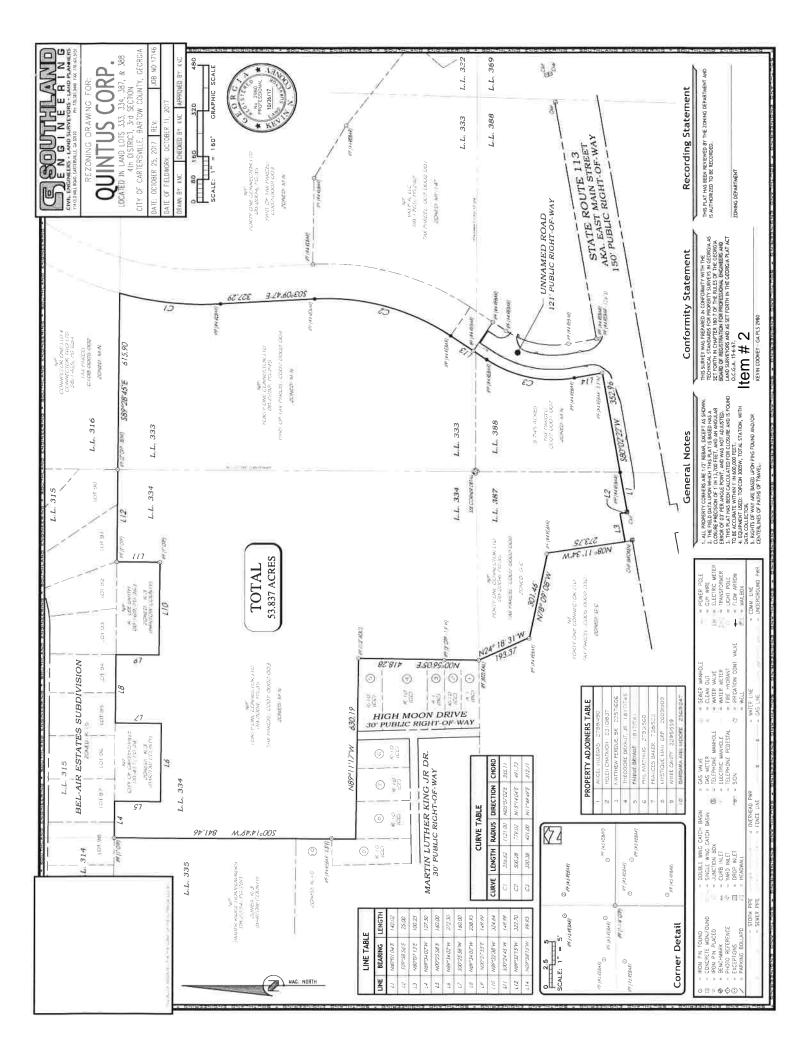

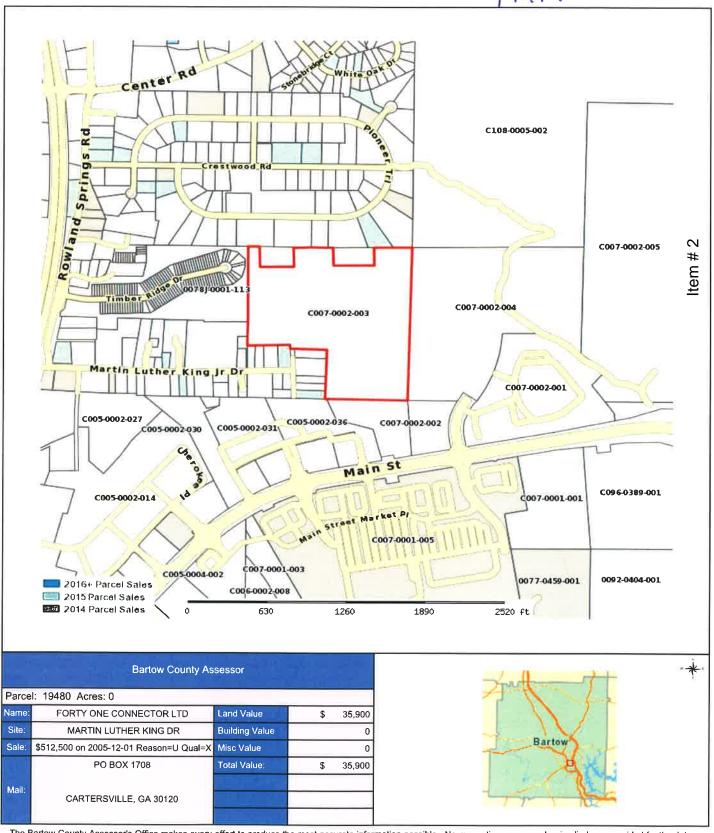

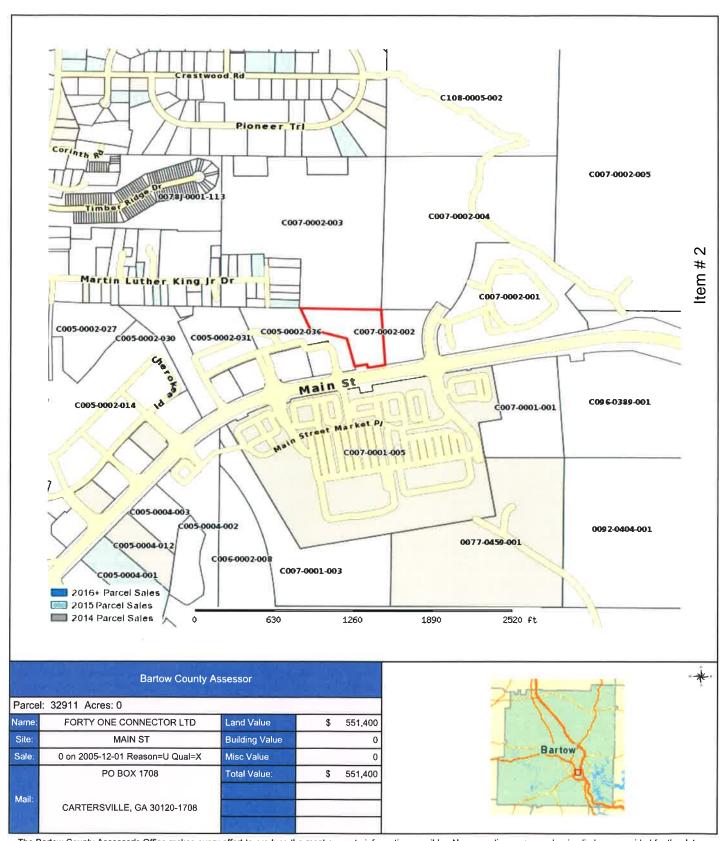

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council have determined that due to the changing market and employment conditions, it is necessary to revise the City of Cartersville Charter to allow the Mayor and City Council, the flexibility to hire a City Manger either at will or by a contract;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-35-3(b)(1) the City has published a notice containing a synopsis of the proposed City of Cartersville Charter Amendment, once a week for the three following weeks on January 25, 2018, February 1, 2018, and on February 8, 2018, in the official organ of Bartow County, Georgia, being The Daily Tribune News;

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council have also, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-35-3(b)(1), provided a copy to the City Clerk of the City of Cartersville and the Clerk of the Superior Court of Bartow County, Georgia, for examination and inspection by the Public;

**WHEREAS**, additionally, the Mayor and City Council, have determined that the Charter should more clearly define the role of the City Manager, and the Mayor and City Council, in regard to the administration of the City and this proposed amendment to the Charter to define the same;

**NOW BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Cartersville, that the City of Cartersville Charter be amended by adding a new <u>Section 2.11 Council Interference with Administration to Article II. City Government</u>, as follows and by deleting <u>Article III Organization and Personnel Section 3.03 – City Manager; appointment, compensation</u> in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

Sec. 2.11. – Council Interference with Administration.

Except for the purpose of inquires and investigations, the Mayor and City Council or its members shall deal with city officers and employees who are subject to the direction and supervision of the City Manager solely through the City Manager, and neither the Mayor or City Council nor its members shall give orders to any such officer or employee, either publicly or privately.

Section 3.03. City Manager, appointment, compensation.

- (a) the Mayor and City Council shall appoint a city manager to serve subject to the pleasure of the Mayor and City If, however, the Mayor and City Council deem it necessary and in the best interests of the City of Cartersville, they are authorized to make a contract with the city manager on such terms as may be mutually agreed upon, the term of the contract not to extend beyond the term of the Mayor and City Council. The contract, however, may include provisions relative to a procedure for removal of the city manager or relative to the termination of the contract.
- (b) The City Manager shall be the head of the administrative branch of the city government. The City manager shall be chosen by the Mayor and City Council on the basis of his/her administrative qualifications with special reference to his/her actual experience in, and knowledge of, the duties of the office as hereinafter prescribed. At the time of his appointment he/she need not be a resident of the City, but shall reside therein during his/her tenure of office. The City Manager shall receive such salary and benefits as the Mayor and City Council shall fix.

It is the intention of the City Council and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Charter of the City of Cartersville, Georgia, and the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

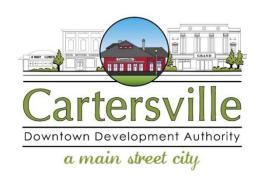

- 13. No parking fees can be charged to attend event.
- 14. All trash must be placed in lidded rolling trashcans or dumpster receptacle next to old Fire Station at end of event. The open metal trash cans on site are NOT to be left full of trash.
- 15. There are NO storage facilities at the Cartersville Welcome Center/DDA. ALL decorations, sound equipment, food, et cetera must be brought in the day of the function and removed at the end of the rental period. The DDA accepts no responsibility for items left of premises.

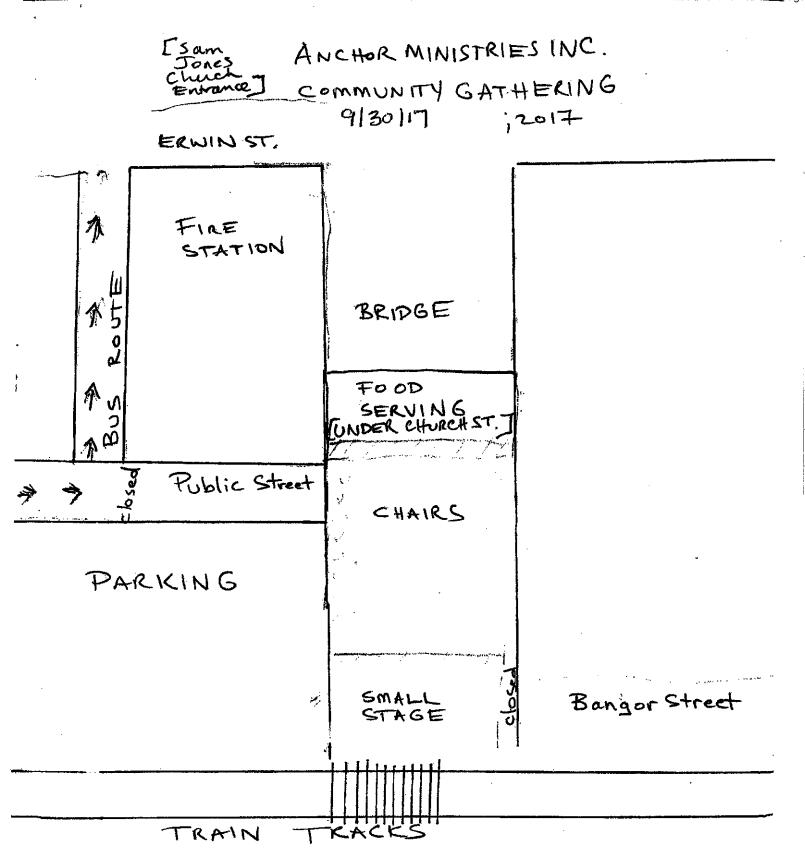

#### City of Cartersville & Cartersville Downtown Development Authority Letter of Agreement

This Letter of Agreement is to set forth the terms of the working relationship between the City of Cartersville, the Cartersville Downtown Development Authority (herein after "DDA") and Sculptor Przemyslaw Kordys dba Da Vinci Studio, LLC (herein after "artist") related to the creation of a sculptural image of a quilt referred to as the Freedom Quilt designed from oral histories and folklore through efforts of the African American Quilt Documentation Project (herein after "AAQDP) in Cartersville, GA. The name of the sculpture will be "Pathways to Freedom".

The artist agrees to design, execute and install one metal sculpture to be developed in accordance with an approved proposal for the interpretation of the quilt. The artist shall rely on research provided by the AAQDP steering committee to determine the exact patterns to be depicted and obtain reference materials as needed to create the work of art. The Art Task Force of the DDA shall have several opportunities to inspect the work in progress and request changes or reject the work and either direct a new model to be created, or prior to casting, sever this agreement, with the artist being paid for work completed up to that point.

Representatives from The Art Task Force and the AAQDP shall inspect the work at the point a proposed composition is produced on paper with sketches used to indicate the size, scope and composition to be created. The Representatives shall then inspect and approve the sample castings & patina prior to final casting.

The City of Cartersville shall own the Artwork created by the Artist pursuant to this contract, provided, however, copyright in the Artwork, including the design, shall be owned by the Artist, subject to following restrictions:

- 1. City of Cartersville may display the Artwork in any place and manner, so long as the integrity of the work is not violated. Prior to the relocation of the Artwork which may become necessary during the life of the artist, Cartersville shall, to the extent practicable, first consult the Artist by sending a notice of such to him at last known address.
- 2. The City may use the image of the Artwork for all standard purposes including, but not limited to, displaying the work(s), lending the work(s), reproducing the work(s) by methods involving photographic, electronic and mechanical means, and displaying, distributing, selling and transmitting such reproductions or images to the general public. Reproductions and transmissions may be released through media such as catalogues, books, brochures, postcards, invitations, magazines, newspapers, journals, films, television, slides, negatives and prints. All reproductions shall bear copyright notice, as prescribed by the Copyright Law of the United States, which shall read as follows ©Przemyslaw Kordys. The effective date of this non-exclusive license shall coincide with the date of ownership of the work(s) of art itself and does not transfer ownership of the copyright to the City of Cartersville.
- 3. Artist shall be entitled to retain and utilize the drawings and models, including photographs of the work for their own exhibitions. The Artist shall further be entitled to reproduce such drawings, models and photographs for use in their portfolios and in books and publication about their work, and to exercise all other reproduction rights provided under the Unites States Copyright laws, except as otherwise restricted by this contract.

City of Cartersville & Cartersville Downtown Development Authority Letter of Agreement

Artist certifies that sculpture is professionally constructed of durable material appropriate for outdoor public display for unlimited duration. Artist further certifies his work is constructed in a manner that shall not cause safety or liability issues and shall not require other than ordinary maintenance during the exhibit period. Should the sculpture fail to meet these standards, Artist agrees to work with the DDA to remedy the situation.

Artist shall install the completed work by April 17, 2018 at location specified by the DDA Art Task Force. Final Location to be selected and prepared no later than March 30, 2018.

For said services the DDA shall pay the sum of \$6,000.00. The organizations involved with the AAQDP are raising funds to help pay for this artwork. The artist shall receive payment as follows:

- 1. one thousand at the time the contract is signed by the DDA Manager;

  - May 12, 2018-March 31, 2020 Public art exhibition
  - April 1, 2020 through April 10, 2020 Artwork to be removed

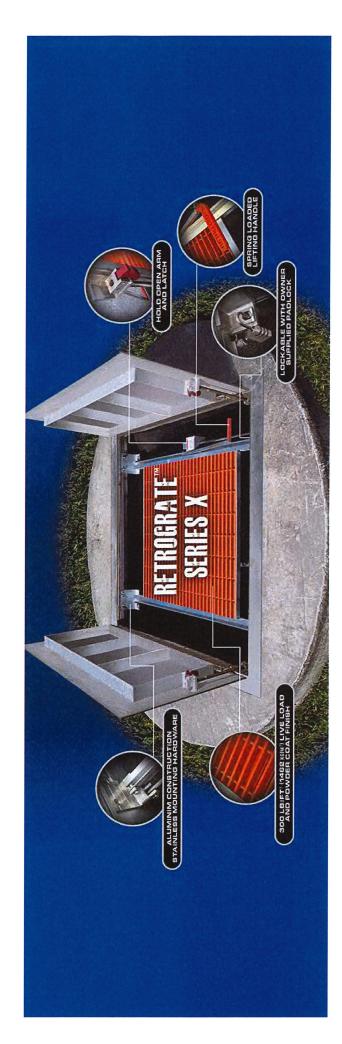

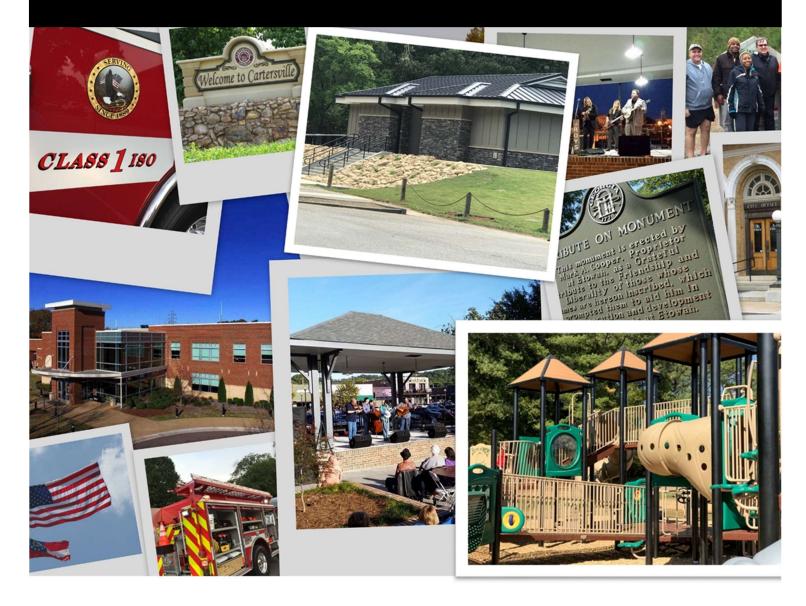
